Dear White Lake Golf Club Members,

The White Lake Golf Club turns 100 years old this year! Special events such as the Founders Centennial Brunch (June 26<sup>th</sup>) and the annual Party at the Pavilion (September 2<sup>nd</sup>) are being planned.

As part of our celebration we are pleased to announce a memorial paver program that will remember and honor those WLGC Family and Friends that have passed on during our first one hundred years. Memorial pavers will be arranged and placed along the first tee where they will be visible to our members and guests.

This concept of developing a memorial program was generated through many discussions with White Lake Golf Club Members over the past few years, especially the morning men's group, "The Old Dogs."

Each 4"x8" paver will be laser etched with the full name of the loved one along with their birth date and date of death. You may also add a personal phrase to the paver. We will collect names throughout this centennial season and begin the installation of the memorial pavers in the fall. A simple form is enclosed for you to complete and return to the WLGC Pro-shop.

Not to rush the inevitable, but you may also pre-arrange your own memorial paver or pre-arrange memorial pavers for your living loved ones. Again, please see the attached form for instructions.

Although we are suggesting a minimum \$100.00 donation per memorial paver, we are hopeful that you will consider a more generous contribution. You may purchase additional pavers for \$75.00 each. Monies collected will be designated to the "Club House Fund" for Club House improvements and/or replacement of the Club House.

One hundred years ago Judge J.P. McGoorty and T.E. Rooney circulated a petition collecting signatures from 58 people who were committed to developing a golf course. Since then throughout our history WLGC members have always stepped up to provide and maintain a beautiful golf course along the shores of our two special lakes. We are now at an important point in our history where we can all make a very personal and meaningful contribution honoring those special people who have gone before us. Please consider participating in this memorial program as you continue to enjoy this incredible playground that we fondly call "The Burial Place of Old Man Gloom!"
