Initially the player's point's; quota is determined by their handicap. As an example, a 7 handicap would start with a quota of 11 points. This is determined by subtracting 7 from 18. 18-7 = 11. Therefore, this player would have to make 11 points to make their quota.

The top 1/3 of the field, whose points are most greater than their quotas, will receive pro-shop credit.

A player's quota is based on points.

A bogie is worth 1 point

A par is worth 2 points

A birdie is worth 4 points

An eagle is worth 6 points

And a double eagle is worth 8 points.
